Roles of RAC and SEAC in the authorisation process


Article 64(4) specifies that the draft opinions shall include the following elements:


- Committee for Risk Assessment (RAC):
 - An assessment of the risk to human health and/or the environment arising from the use(s) of the substance, including the appropriateness and effectiveness of the risk management measures and, if relevant, an assessment of the risks arising from possible alternatives;
- Committee for Socio-economic Analysis (SEAC):
 - An assessment of the socio-economic factors and the availability, suitability and technical feasibility of alternatives




The opinions of RAC and SEAC

- The opinions are focussed on giving advice on
 - whether the argumentation is robust
 - whether, after an assessment of all information, the applicant's application for authorisation seems justifiable
 - possible conditions and monitoring arrangements as well as the duration of the review period.
- Use one format for opinions and their grounds
- The grounds will contain detailed justification/reason
 - for the opinions of both RAC and SEAC.
- Opinions to be prepared in close cooperation between RAC and SEAC (coordinated through rapporteurs' dialogues)











Preparations

- In-depth discussions on the principles for the Committees' work with applications for authorisations
- Working procedures and templates
 - Conformity check working procedure & template to document outcome (agreed)
 - Working procedure for opinion-making (agreed) & format of the opinion (almost finalised)
 - Working procedure for appointment of rapporteurs (agreed)



Main challenges

- Very tight timelines for the Committees' opinion-making
- Information has to be available early in the process
- Committees' workload will be closely monitored working methods modified as needed
