Before using gas, carefully read the safety cards

Always use personal protection equipment (P.P.E.) when handling gas cylinders







To move a cylinder, check balance first, keep one hand on the cap, the cylinder next to the body, and rotate the drum with the other hand.

The cylinders are heavy! A 50 litre cylinder weighs approx. 80 Kg.

Be careful of twisting body parts and erroneous movements.

NEVER TRY TO CATCH A FALLING CYLINDER!

Whether stored or in use, keep cylinders firmly fixed in order to avoid falling.

A CYLINDER THAT DOES NOT HAVE A CAP AND FALLS, TURNS INTO A MISSILE!







Never turn your back on a cylinder that you deposit without fixing it in place.

USE GOOD PRACTICE AND SECURE THE CYLINDERS

To remove, or insert, a cylinder from a ramp or basket, place one hand on the cap and the other on the ogive.

BE WARY ABOUT YOUR FINGERS!



Never use cylinders for reasons other than those for which they are intended.

















When opening the valve or acting on the reducer, always do so slowly and place yourself at the opposite side from where the gas is released!!!

ATTENTION: A FLEXIBLE TUBE CONNECTED IMPROPERLY, OR WHICH BREAKS, TURNS INTO A WHIP!



It is forbidden to use secondrate fittings on gas cylinders!



SCHLACK



Stored cylinders must not be exposed to direct sun light.

KEEP FULL CYLINDERS SEPARATE FROM EMPTY ONES

KEEP COMBUSTIBLE GAS SEPARATE FROM OXIDISING GAS

Always identify the ideal place for storing cylinders.







It is dangerous:

To lay Acetylene cylinders flat

To use Oxygen for cleaning yourself
