- Article 66 notification authorised uses NEW
- Article 7(2) notification substances in articles

Check if your use is authorised

Notify within three months

How to submit the notification





- Check if your substance is on the Authorisation List
 - <u>echa.europa.eu/addressing-chemicals-of-</u> <u>concern/authorisation/recommendation-for-inclusion-in-the-authorisation-list/authorisation-list</u>
 - Sept 2015: 31 substances
 - Check the sunset date
 - Exemptions from authorisation:

Check if your use is authorised

- Check the label of the product and the safety data sheet you receive
- Authorised use: REACH Authorisation number in the format "REACH/xx/xx/x"
- Exposure scenario describing conditions of use comply
- If no authorisation number, contact supplier





Notify ECHA within three months

- From the first delivery of the substance after the publication of the authorisation decision
- Through a webform on ECHA's website
- Your customers may also need to notify ECHA
- Situations where you don't need to notify:
 - you own the application
 - you are a distributor who doesn't use the substance
 - you use the substance as an intermediate

Submit your notification using the webform

You must have an active REACH-IT account (see steps 1 and 2 below) to be able to submit your notification.

- Sign up in REACH-IT (you can skip this step if your company already has a REACH-IT account).
- Log into REACH-IT to have your user account activated (you can skip this step if you have already logged into the REACH-IT at least once).
- Click on the button below and follow the instructions to submit your downstream user notification using the webform.

Article 7(2) – substances in articles

- Importers/producers to notify ECHA if Candidate List substances are in their articles, under certain conditions
- Conditions:
 - Substance present > 0.1 % wt/wt
 - Substance present in total > 1 tonne/year
 - Exposure is foreseeable during the article lifetime
 - Substance has not already been registered for the use
- Check the Candidate List here:
 - echa.europa.eu/candidate-list-table
- Notify here (webform/REACH-IT):
 - <u>echa.europa.eu/support/dossier-submission-tools/reach-it/notifying-</u> substances-in-articles

*ECJ: An article used as component of a complex article remains an article




Article 38(1) – unsupported uses

- Unsupported uses are those that are not supported by the exposure scenarios of your supplier(s)
- Report within six months of receipt of SDS with registration number, under certain conditions
- Conditions:
 - Conduct a downstream user chemical safety report (DU CSR)
 - Claim exemption from conducting a DU CSR
- Report here (webform/REACH-IT):
 - echa.europa.eu/support/dossier-submission-tools/reachit/downstream-user-report



Article 38 (4) – classification difference

If your classification is different to that of all of your suppliers,
 REACH requires you to report this to ECHA



- Contact suppliers
- Exempt if total quantity of use is < 1 tonne per year
- Report here (REACH-IT only):
